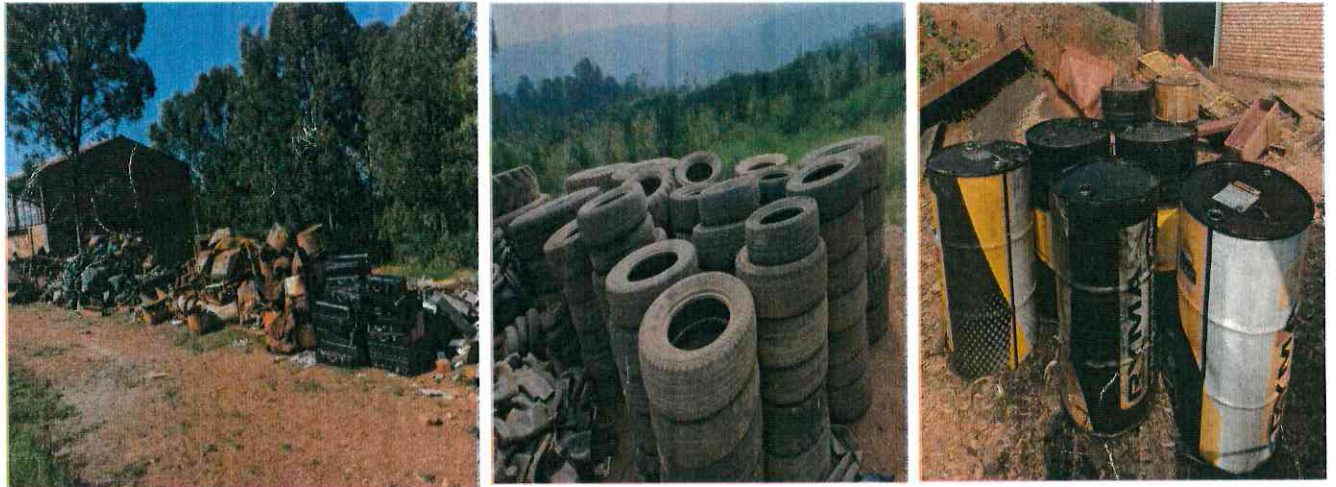


NOTE FOR APPROVAL FOR TRINITY MUSHA MINES SCRAP SALE

1. BACKGROUND

At the Musha Mines, scrap materials are collected and dumped in the scrapyard, where they are sorted in batches. All materials deemed suitable for re-use are removed from the scrapyard, while the remaining items are verified as scrap by the engineering, mining, and management teams. Plastics are separated from metals, and personal protective equipment (PPE) is also sorted and placed aside. Also, Nyakabingo and Rutongo Mines were invited for a site visit at Musha scrap for checking if there are items that can be used at Musha which they confirmed had no interest in the scrap items. In line with company policies and procedures, this document is being prepared for the approval process.
