



EXPRESSION OF INTEREST FOR PERFORMING HYGIENE SURVEYS ACROSS THE THREE TRINITY METALS MINES (RUTONGO, NYAKABINGO AND MUSHA)

Trinity Metals Ltd is seeking a qualified service provider to undertake hygiene surveys at its three mines covering a scope of work as reflected in the description below.

Scope of Work for hygiene surveys:

The scope of the work includes but is not limited to the following:

1. Pre-assessment of the hygiene risk exposure of the three mines

- Visiting the three mines mentioned separately to adjust the scope of work slightly where required
- Providing a formal quotation to Trinity Metals for the work to be conducted. The hygiene surveys planned include the following:

2. Air quality/ventilation monitoring:

- The three mines vary in geological areas covered and in operational areas. Air quality monitoring needs to be conducted inclusive of dust monitoring, CO, Co₂, No and Oxygen monitoring. The estimated scope of monitoring per mine is as follows:
 - Rutongo:64
 - Nyakabingo: 42
 - Musha: 36
- Ventilation studies/sufficient air flow monitoring needs to be conducted at all three mines in all tunnels and on a sample basis at workplaces (Roughly 60 sample points).
- Personal air quality monitors will need to be placed on roughly the same number of employees for air quality monitoring.
- Vehicle/mobile equipment air quality monitoring and temperature assessment: 12 heavy mobile mining equipment across the three mines.
- Chemical fume assessments at all mine's workshops
- Dust monitoring needs to be measured at 3 Upgrade areas and one Plant.

3. Noise surveys:

To be done at the following measurement areas per mine:

- Rock drill operators, one section per mine



- 3-4 Sampling points per upgrade area and plant
- Three different types of heavy mobile mining equipment per mine
- 2 Locomotive operators for Nyakabingo and Rutongo each
- 4 Sampling points at each mine's workshop
- 5 LDV's inside the cabs
- 5 Bobcat operators

4. Vibration studies:

- Rock drill operators, one section per mine
- 3-4 Sampling points per plant
- Three different types of heavy mobile mining equipment per mine
- 2 Locomotive operators for Nyakabingo and Rutongo each
- 5 LDV's inside the cabs
- 5 Bobcat operators

5. Light intensity studies:

Perform as follows:

- In 8 tunnels at different mines plus charging bays at Rutongo and Musha at night time
- In all office areas at the three mines, including operational areas like upgrade areas and workshops
- Day and night readings at the Rutongo plant

6. High level ergonomic assessment:

Perform as follows:

- The intent is not a detailed ergonomic study but an indication of where we need to improve to advance employee Health and safety and general employee productivity

Eligibility and Competency Requirements

Interested parties must:

1. Be a certified hygiene assessor (Governmental Approved Inspection Authority, or similar)
2. Have underground experience in hygiene surveys and monitoring
3. Make use of qualified hygienists for the survey (Qualifications will need to be provided upon entering into agreement)
4. Preferably have a quality certification (ISO 9001, or similar)



5. Provide a detailed report with recommendations within a month after the surveys were conducted

All interested parties should submit an Expression of Interest in accordance with the below requirements complete with supporting documents.

- Application Cover Letter introducing your company/individual, expressing interest, availability, and a brief business and experience profile including qualifications and experience.
- CVs of proposed personnel who will perform the surveys
- Summary of qualifications and relevant experience.
- Indicative timeframe and approach.
- Details of at least three similar projects undertaken in the last five years.
- VAT Registration.
- Valid income tax clearance issued in country of origin

Expressions of Interest received after the deadline will unfortunately not be considered.
